NOTICE OF SUSPENSION

Dear Raymond Ramdeo:
Based on a report compiled by the Department of Public Safety, between June 1, 2022, to September 26, 2022, and Berry Inspection, 2P037514. You, Inspector Raymond Ramdeo, used the electronic connector of one vehicle to enable another vehicle to pass the emissions test fifty-three (53) times. This is a Violation of:
Texas Administrative Code (TAC) § 23.62 (c)(3)(D) Emissions testing the exhaust or electronic connector of one vehicle for the purpose of enabling another vehicle to pass the emissions test (clean piping or clean scanning).
Texas Department of Public Safety has assessed a suspension of 12 months.
This letter is to inform you that the DPS is taking the action, for the listed violation(s). Under the Texas Transportation Code 548.407, you have the right to an administrative hearing.

The request must be submitted within thirty (30) calendar days after receipt of this notice. If no appeal request is submitted within thirty (30) calendar days of the date this notice was received, the right to appeal is waived and the action will become final.

Upon receipt of a timely appeal request, the department will schedule a telephonic settlement conference and you will be notified of the date and time. The purpose of the settlement conference is to provide an opportunity for you to offer testimony and to explain why the department's action should not be assessed.

Following a settlement conference, you will be advised in writing of the department's final determination. If a settlement is not reached and you wish to contest the department's final determination, the decision may then be appealed to the State Office of Administrative Hearings.
